## Elections to the committee and constitutional changes

This year there are two committee posts up for election (subject to agreement by the AGM). I warned last year's AGM that I would be standing down this year as newsletter editor, because I have the next PALA conference to organise, and feel it is the right time to give someone else a chance to thrill you all three times a year! We had two nominations for this post by the closing date of January 31<sup>st</sup>, and they are:

# Michael Burke and Dan McIntyre

We are also hoping to reverse a constitutional change made a few years ago, to merge the posts of treasurer and membership secretary. Peter Stockwell has valiantly been carrying both of these roles, but we feel it is too much for one committee member, and will therefore be asking the AGM to approve the addition of membership secretary as a separate post. Having approved this change, we will then be asking the AGM to elect someone to the role, so what we need from you now are the nominations. Please send nominations to Isil (Chair) and Urszula (Secretary) by 15<sup>th</sup> June (email addresses below). If potential nominees wish to find out more about what is involved in the role,

please contact Peter. Names of nominees and short statements by them (and by Michael and Dan – please!) will be on the website in June.

These are likely to be the last committee members elected at the AGM itself. In the past there have been few contested nominations, but it seems that more and more people wish to help PALA by serving on the committee, and as we grow ever more international, it seems only right to make sure that members throughout the world have a chance to vote in committee elections, whether or not they are able to attend the annual conference. We will therefore be asking the AGM to approve changes to the constitution (enclosed) which will result in future elections being held by email and postal voting. We have yet to finalise the details, and the question of secret balloting will be debated at the conference, but this step is one that we hope will enable more of our members to feel involved.

The proposed changes to the constitution (see attached) are as follows:

Section 3 d. e) of the constitution - the insertion of a clause between the first and second to read: 'to ratify the results of elections as necessary'.

Section 1 of the constitution - the number of members required to summon a Special General Meeting to be altered from 12 to one third of the membership.

### Changes to subscription rates

After years of exceptionally low subscription rates, the committee wishes to raise rates from £40 to £50 for membership plus journal, from £10 to £20 for standard membership and to leave the student/unwaged subscription unchanged at £5. The reason for this change is partly because of the increased cost of mailing but also to increase student bursaries and to create funds to support other events such as mini conferences and postgrad conferences. The AGM will be asked to vote on this change.

### CALL FOR PAPERS on PEDAGOGICAL STYLISTICS

The field of stylistics has greatly developed since the late 1950s. One cannot state that it is simply an interface between literature and linguistics any longer, especially after the development of cognitive studies. We are interested in publishing an edited volume on the state of the art of stylistics, specifically in classroom contexts. How has pedagogical stylistics developed since the late 1950s? Where do we stand now? How has research in this area progressed? What are the prospects for the future in terms of research and application? These are some of the issues which we believe should belong to this volume. In order not to influence the scope of submissions, we refrain from setting predefined sections. On the contrary, we welcome a wide variety of submissions from theoretical discussions, relations between stylistics and new technology, research on students' response to texts, and all sorts of classroom applications.

Submissions should be preceded by 300-500 word abstracts. All work must be original, non-published material and should follow the style of the Instructions to Authors published in *Language and Literature*. Language of submission should be English, and we especially welcome work from non-English speaking countries. All papers will be reviewed.

The proposed timetable for this project is:

Submission of abstract: December 2004

Submission of papers (upon invitation): July 2005.

Submission of manuscript to reputable publisher:December 2005
